

**TOWN OF LACOMBE
BYLAW 111**

A bylaw of the Town of Lacombe, in the Province of Alberta, for the purpose of closing and selling a portion of a public highway.

A bylaw of the Town of Lacombe for the purpose of closing and selling a portion of a public highway in accordance with Section 180 and 183 of the Municipal Government Act, Chapter M26, Revised Statutes of Alberta, 1980;

WHEREAS, the lands hereafter described are no longer required for public travel, and

WHEREAS, application had been made to Council to have the highway closed, and

WHEREAS, notice of intention of Council to pass a Bylaw has been mailed by registered mail to persons registered or assessed as owners of the land abutting that portion of the highway so proposed to be closed, at least two weeks before the date fixed for the passing of the bylaw, and

WHEREAS, notice of intention of Council to pass a Bylaw has been published in the Lacombe Globe on August 24th and August 31st, 1988, the last of such publication being at least two weeks before the day fixed for the passing of the Bylaw; and

WHEREAS, Council was not petitioned for an opportunity to be heard by any person prejudicially affected by the Bylaw;

NOW THEREFORE BE IT RESOLVED that the Council, of the Town of Lacombe, does hereby close the following described highway;

- Firstly: The most northerly six (6) feet in perpendicular width of the most easterly one hundred and fifty (150) feet in perpendicular width of the road (56th Avenue) as shown on Plan 842-2069 in the NW 30-40-26-W4.
- Secondly: All that portion of the mostly westerly two (2) feet in perpendicular width of the Street (53rd Street) as shown on Plan 6939 KS which lies north of a line drawn across said portion, parallel to and one hundred and fifty-six (156) feet perpendicular south of the most northerly boundary of said street.

Subject to rights of access granted by other legislation or regulations.
