

**TOWN OF LACOMBE
BYLAW 299**

A Bylaw of the Town of Lacombe in the Province of Alberta for the purpose of closing to public travel and create title to portions of a public highway in accordance with Section 22 of the Municipal Government Act, R.S.A. 2000, c. M-26.

WHEREAS, the lands hereafter described are no longer required for public travel, and

WHEREAS, application has been made to Council to have the road closed, and

WHEREAS, the Council of the Town of Lacombe deems it expedient to provide for a bylaw for the purpose of closing to public travel certain roads, or portions thereof, situated in the said municipality, and thereafter creating title to, and

WHEREAS, Attachment 'A' which shows the location of the land described hereafter, is attached and forms part of this Bylaw, and

WHEREAS, Notice of the intention of Council to pass a bylaw has been given in accordance with section 606 of the Municipal Government Act, and

WHEREAS Council was not petitioned for an opportunity to be heard by any person claiming to be prejudicially affected by the bylaw.

NOW THEREFORE BE IT RESOLVED that the Council of the Town of Lacombe, in the Province of Alberta, does hereby close to public travel and create title to the following described highway, subject to the rights of access granted by other legislation:

1. Plan 4401 TR

All that portion of 64th Street lying north of the production easterly of the north boundary of Lot 51 Block 1 Plan 7820684 containing 0.58 hectares (1.43 acres) more or less

Excepting thereout all mines and minerals


