

Lacombe Community Safety Calendar

An opportunity for kids of all ages to get creative!

The City of Lacombe has partnered with FortisAlberta to create a Community Safety Calendar for 2022.

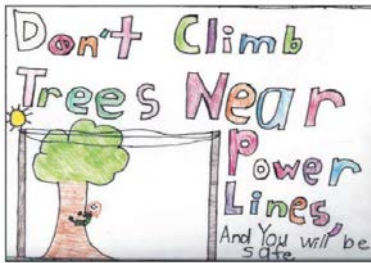
Children of City Staff and those living in Lacombe and Lacombe County can create pictures that may be included in the calendar!

Age categories include ages: 1 – 4, 5 – 9, 10 – 13, and 14 – 18. Each child may submit one picture, and the first 250 pictures received will be included in the calendar. Each child will receive a complimentary copy! The remaining calendars may be purchased for \$10 by family, friends and community members, with funds supporting the Lacombe Arts Endowment Fund. How cool is that?

You can draw safety scenes for all seasons, with topics potentially including:

- Spring – melting ice hazards, bicycle hazards, cleaning up the yard, playing at the dog park etc.
- Summer – swimming, boating, camping, jet skiing, hiking etc.
- Fall – avoiding power lines during harvest, farm implement safety, working in the kitchen, playing outside etc.
- Winter – Christmas, ice and falls, tobogganing, skiing, snowmobiling, online computer safety etc.

Be sure to:

- include lots of colours, people and a safety message and create your pictures wide, not tall (landscape) on an 8.5" x 11" piece of paper.
- create your poster between August 1 and September 30, 2021. Images will be randomly drawn for the top page of each month, and the rest will be placed throughout the calendar. All pictures will be displayed in the LMC in November too!
- gently print your name, age, address, phone number and your or your parent's e-mail on the back of your picture. We say gently because we don't want this to show through on the front of your picture.
- drop off your picture at one of these locations before noon on September 30, 2021:
